Year 4 Curriculum Overview Term 3 2024



English- Exploring a Quest Novel- 'Rowan of Rin'

Students will read and analyse a quest novel. Students will also write a short response explaining how the author represents the main character in an important event in the quest novel.




HASS- 'Using places sustainably'

Students will describe the characteristics of places, including the types of natural vegetation and native animals. They will examine the interconnections between people and environment and the importance of environments to animals and people.

Mathematics

Students will investigate physical properties of materials and consider

Students will explore and manipulate different types of data and transform data into information. They will create a digital solution that presents data as meaningful information to address a school or community issue (such as how lunch waste can be reduced).
